

The Aubrey Hickman Award (£500 biennially to a graduate student)

Aubrey Hickman (1922–1986)

Aubrey was a founder member of SEMPRES, and its first Honorary Treasurer. In 1980 he was elected Chair of the ISME Research Commission. He was a fine viola player and composer as well as a teacher, lecturer and academic, publishing papers on statistics, the philosophy of music, creativity and perception. His intellectual integrity was matched with a generosity of spirit, particularly to newcomers to these areas of research.

Purpose of the Award

The Aubrey Hickman Award is intended to promote original research from new researchers in the field.

Eligibility

The Award is offered biennially to a graduate student (a doctoral research student or individual who is normally no more than two years post graduation at the time of the conference) submitting the best paper to the Society's two-day Easter conference (see <http://www.sempre.org.uk/awardshickman>).

Criteria

The Aubrey Hickman Award will be given in recognition of a paper that offers a significant and previously unpublished contribution to the knowledge and understanding of music education and/or music psychology.

Applying

Applicants should submit an extended abstract of 2000–3000 words to the SEMPRES Conference Secretary by the due deadline (see below). Conditions of acceptance of the award are that the winner will present a conference paper at the Society's Spring conference and that the full research paper (of 6000–8000 words) is offered first to the journal *Psychology of Music* for consideration for publication. **Applicants for the award in 2017** will present a paper at the two-day Society **International Conference on Musical Cultures**, which will take place at the **University of Hull, 3-5 April 2017**. Applications are invited from people submitting abstracts for the above conference as well as any other eligible person.

The decision-making process

The SEMPRES Awards panel will be involved in judging applications in addition to members of the organising committee of the two-day conference, a SEMPRES committee member (if one is not involved in organising the conference) and the Editor of the *Psychology of Music*. Submissions will be judged according to the quality of the research described, its significance to the field, originality and the clarity with which it is presented.

Applicants will be informed of the outcome at least eight weeks before the conference is held. The decision of the panel is final, and the Society regrets that it is unable to enter into any correspondence regarding its decision.
